Dear Brother & Sister.

I take the pleasure this evening to answer your letter which we received yesterday evening glad to hear that you got out safe I hope you will have a nice time out. Thank and keep good health while you are gone. Ma. is getting better she goes out on the porch some times. the Dr. hasn't bin here since Tuesday. I was very sick Saturday as I didn't have time to take rest so though I would get up again. Howard and I took a ride on the two bays yesterday evening we put them strait through when we came home they glistered so that we almost though we were on glass John Broo said ~~Friday~~ evening that dock would be cold you were gone that he wad get ~~sick~~.

you and Hollie ort to bin here yesterday
we had some the best water melons that
ever was. Mrs. Maughn was here we give her
some she said that it was the best melon
she ever raised. they are a very large ones down
in the spring house. know ready to eat if
you and wife comes and gets it you can have it
they are some very large ones down in the
patch ripe. the boys dug your sweet potatoes
in the garden they made a bushel and I picked
your bird eggs beans this evening. That's was
ripe. I got 15. and ^{more} I think they are them
many more. I expect you will get fat of your
beans. we thrashed last Wednesday. We only
thrashed the seed near. uncle John ~~had~~
and susa. Behler had bin very sick the were
getting a little better the last we heard.
from them, 1777 is 1855

I must stop writing for this time
it is getting late it is time for all chicken
to be at / rast. this leaves us all well.
and I hope it will find you both well,
write soon and tell us about the west
